How did it all begin ?

- The centre was formed in 2007 when an idea to join single mothers and girls, that did not have an opportunity of completing their education, occurred.
- Current president of NWC got into contact with one Slovenian researcher who was in Kigali at that time.
- They discussed options of forming an association, and managed to gather women together that were prepared to take part in a group.

Who we are ?

- Association is comprised of marginalized women of different ages (18–41).
- Group's members come from different cultural, religious and social backgrounds, and have different levels of education ranging from illiterate women to university graduates.
- NWC is supported by the Peace Institute from Slovenia and the Rwanda Association of University Women (RAUW).



What is our goal ?

- To **empower** NWC to become self-sustainable in long-term and a factor of influence in the local community.
- To **empower** disadvantaged **women and girls** in their pursuit of better opportunities for employment, education and trainings.
- To **increase** local community's **awareness** on women's and children's rights, and to enhance the social integration of vulnerable groups of women.

How to achieve it ?

- Through different **trainings** and **workshops** held by RAUW, volunteers and external experts on themes such as gender-based violence, women's empowerment, women's access to education and employment opportunities.
- With **educational** and **training programs** for the members of the NWC and women from the local community, namely with English course, literacy course, ICT trainings, accountancy trainings, etc.
- With **community-based tourism**.
- With purchase of land and house for NWC.

What community based tourism is ?

- It is a core activity of self-income generating activities of the centre.
- Established with the help of the local partner- New Dawn Associates (NDA), that offered training on tourism and shared some experiences with the members of the centre.
- Offers visitors and tourists a tour around Nyamirambo district - very interesting lively and diverse part of Kigali.
- Visitors get familiar with their traditional food, learn some Kinyarwandan words, visit Biryogo market, hair-dresser and tailor.
