RANKING: APPROACHES TO INTEGRATION

Countries have been then sorted in groups based on their scores on the three dimensions of integration (basic rights, equal opportunity, secure future). These groups represent different country's approaches to integration. We identified four main approaches:

Comprehensive integration. A comprehensive approach to integration guarantees equal rights, opportunities and security for immigrants.

Equality on paper. Equality on paper means that immigrants enjoy equal rights and long-term security, but not equal opportunities.

Temporary integration. Temporary integration means that immigrants enjoy basic rights and equal opportunities, but not equal security, as they face obstacles to settle long-term.

Immigration without integration (Integration Denied). Immigration without integration means that immigrants are denied basic rights and equal opportunities, even if they are able to settle long-term in the country.

Within each of these four categories, there are a range of policies. In other words, countries with the same approach to integration may have more or less developed policies. Therefore, countries are categorised under 10 different groups that reflect their overall approach to integration and their level of policy development.

KEY FINDINGS

Integration policies in the 52 MIPEX countries are, on average, only halfway favourable (50/100). That means, on average, countries' policies are creating as many obstacles as opportunities for immigrants to participate and settle in their new home country.
